

CATHOLIC CEMETERIES - CO-BURIAL

(Co-Burial in Permanent Burial Lot, Permanent Urn Burial Lot or Urn Niche
Clause 8 of the Rules of the Catholic Cemeteries refers)

1. The first interment should be in the Permanent Burial Lot, Permanent Urn Burial Lot or Urn Niche;
2. After the first interment, one subsequent co-burial may be permitted;
3. The newly deceased must either be a Catholic or a Catechumen by the Catholic Rite ;
4. The newly deceased must either be the spouse, unmarried child or unmarried brother/sister of the first interred;
5. Persons arranging a Co-burial should produce the following documents original:
 - A. Official receipt of burial lot or urn niche allocated to the first interred;
 - B. For co- burial with spouse, Marriage Certificate to be provided. For co-burial with unmarried child or unmarried brother/sister, original documentary proof of relationship between the two deceased and Certificate of Absence of Marriage Record to be provided;
 - C. Burial Permit in the Catholic Cemetery for the newly deceased;
 - D. Burial documents : The Certificate of Registration of Death (Form10) or The Certificate of Order Authorizing Burial of Body (Form 11)/ Authorisation to Exhume Remains/ Permit to Take Away Cremated Ashes;
 - E. The HKID of the newly deceased and Death Certificate (if available).
6. The applicant shall pay the fees for grave demolition and concrete paving 14 days prior to exhumation of the human remains of the first interred and notify the Cemetery Office the date of exhumation (the dates for notification and exhumation are not inclusive)
 - A. Payment can be made by Cash/Cheque/Credit Card Visa or Master (Credit Card payment is not available in Happy Valley Catholic Cemetery);
 - B. Cheque for payment shall be made payable to:
 - B.1 For Cheung Sha Wan, Sai Kung or Cheung Chau Catholic Cemeteries
- The Bishop of the Roman Catholic Church in HK (St. Raphael's Cemetery)
 - B.2 For Chai Wan Catholic Cemetery
- The Bishop of the Roman Catholic Church in HK (Holy Cross Cemetery)
 - B.3 For Happy Valley Catholic Cemetery
- The Bishop of the Roman Catholic Church in HK (St. Michael's Cemetery)
7. For co-burial of exhumed human remains/ashes of the newly deceased in burial lot, the co-burial fee shall be paid at the date of co-burial;
8. For co-burial of ashes in urn niche, the co-burial fee shall be paid at the time of application.

- (1) For co-burial of ashes in urn niche, the ashes shall be produced at the time of application.
- (2) Should there be adjustment on the above fees, the revised fees prevailing at the time of application shall be paid.
